Women's weekend Away St Rhadagands Isle of Wight Peter: Who had to get out of the boat to walk on water

June 11th - 13th 2010



Peter wasn't a superstar, he was an ordinary human being, just like you and me. Jesus rebuked Peter more than he praised him. Peter encouraged Jesus to run away from the cross, he boasted about sticking by Jesus no matter what the cost and within twenty-four hours denied he even knew him ... three times. Peter was embarrassed over his relationship with Gentile believers when his Jewish friends were around. He said and did things without thinking them through.

But when the Master said "Come"; he went. It led to a very different Peter than we read about in the Gospels. At the end of his life, Peter the "rock" writes to a newborn church "For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." (II Peter 1:5-8)

Peter didn't begin to sink until he started looking around at the wind and the waves. Taking our eyes off Jesus, and focusing on other things, will cause us to sink beneath the waves. But when we cry out to Jesus, he catches us by the hand and raises us above the seemingly impossible surroundings.

As we look at the life of Peter The Opengate women's weekend away is an opportunity to dig deeper into our personal lives and focus on Jesus

Come join us for a weekend getaway and get connected with other members of the Church. The weekend will be a time for growing relationships, making new friends, laughing as well as teaching, sharing together and praying for each other.

The weekend will be at St Rhadagunds hotel on the Isle of Wight over the weekend 11th - 13th June.



St Rhadagunds, part of the Christian Endeavour group, is set in six acres of beautiful grounds with views over the English Channel just two miles from Ventnor.

Accommodation will be in rooms of 2, 3 or 4 people. There may be a possibility of a single room depending on the number of people on the weekend. Some of the rooms have an en suite bath or shower and are available on a first come first serve basis. The cost of the weekend, to include full board from Friday evening to Sunday lunch time and ferry crossing will be as follows:

- shared Standard Room £105 per person
- supplement for an ensuite room £5 per person (£110 total)
- supplement for a standard single room £5 per person (£110 per person)
- supplement for a single ensuite room £15 per person (£120 per person)

Evening meal followed by worship and Introduction to the weekend

Breakfast

The morning will be a mixture of worship, teaching and sharing lunch
